Since the publication of Volume I, additional names have been shared by Civil War "buffs" and descendants, resulting in 3,000 forgotten Black Union soldiers now remembered.




BATTLE OF PLYMOUTH, NORTH CAROLINA (April 17-20, 1864): THE LAST CONFEDERATE VICTORY


TELL ME WHY DEAR BENNETT: MEMOIRS OF BENNETT BELLES Volume II \$33.00
